Defibrillator Training

- Just in case this issue of the Chat is distributed early ...
- There will be (free) defibrillator training in the Village Hall on Sat 29 Mar 9.30-11.30 am. Please arrive before 9.30 am.
- Readers might like to bear in mind that 80% of heart attacks happen at home, so you may be the one to save the life of the person you live with! A good reason to attend the training every couple of years or so.

Annual Parish Meeting

- Saturday 5 April in the Village Hall, doors open at 1030am for a cup of coffee/tea and a biscuit before an 1100 start. We aim to finish by about 1230-1245pm.
- All welcome. Especially anyone new to the village or wider Parish.
- There will be reports by the PC Chairman and our Wiltshire Cllr and the opportunity to ask them questions.
- Also an item about the Village Hall's role as the Community Emergency Hub – come and find out what this is about.

Shindig Festival 22-25 May

- As announced in the last Chat - Shindig festival is coming to Charlton Park. They say they are a family-friendly festival with lots of activities for children – and for that reason they schedule themselves in half-term.
- Like WOMAD, **they have invited residents of the parish to visit free on Thursday, 22 May**, between 3pm and midnight.
- Entrance will be, like with WOMAD, by means of a letter which you obtain from the Parish Clerk. The letter allows in a small household group – you will not need one for every person going in.
- **Send a stamped self-addressed envelope stating how many letters you need to the Parish Clerk - M R Bromley Gardner, Coombe Cottage, Charlton SN16 9DR.**
- Unlike with WOMAD, **you will not be able to walk in** – you must drive in (or cycle) through the South

Lodges gate off the B4040 at Charlton Bridge – Shindig's Red Gate. There will be stewards to show you where to park and where to go from there.

- It will be located at the Elm Hill area (SN16 9DS), at the junction of Pink Lane and Pond Lane, on an external and easily-accessible wall of Great Elm Farm (with the kind permission of the farmer) just off Pond Lane.

- It will be in a locked container. The code number will be given to those residents in the local area – if you haven't got it ask the Parish Clerk.

Wiltshire Farming Club - Malmesbury Club.

The Wiltshire Farming Club was formed originally in 1928, as the Dairy Students Club and organised by a Mrs Ida Bull, who was apparently a very formidable lady who was very good at getting everyone to do what was necessary and extract support from businesses to keep the show on the road. There were at one time 7 Districts and mainly in the North of the county and a membership that was over a thousand.

Sadly those day's are long gone and there are now only 3 Clubs, Marlborough, Poulshot near Devizes and our Malmesbury Club. The other two have a membership of around 30 members each, whereas ours has dropped to about half, and if it wasn't for Joyce Smith, who with her late husband Don, retired back to Charlton, where her parents had farmed as tenants of the Charlton Park Estate, would have disappeared along with the others that have.

We meet in the afternoon of the second Tuesday of the month, in Charlton Village Hall, unless there is an away visit, as we had recently to the Alvan Blanch Development Company, who are at Chedworth, Crudwell, and were established in 1952 with their 'Strap line', "Processing the World's Crops". With over 80% of their business being overseas, have a look at their website: www.alvanblanchgroup.com for a fascinating look at the local family owned business.

We have other visits planned for the Summer, including in May to a Sheep Milking flock at Aldbourne, near Marlborough and before that in April a talk by Nigel Durnford, who runs two flocks of sheep, a Texel flock for producing terminal Rams for prime lamb production, and Shropshire sheep for grazing amongst trees, and not eating them! But Nigel had a lifetime career as a Diseases of Animals Inspector with Wiltshire and Gloucestershire County Councils.

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED FOR MAY 10TH

On May 10th, Charlton will be busy, as announced in the last issue of the Parish Chat, with the main focus being a World Record being attained at the Church (sound proofing will reduce the normal volume) for the most number of Bell Ringers going through a Tower in a 12 hour period. As it is a Groundfloor ring, we can have a swift changeover, so there is the possibility of having several hundred ringing, with 6 at a time, for 5 minutes. There will be a Mobile Belfry at the Village Hall where local non ringers will be able to come and 'have a go'. COMMUNITY SPEED WATCH – VOLUNTEERS REQUIRED

As many Charlton residents will be aware, the village runs a Community Speed Watch (CSW) team of volunteers which operates with Wiltshire Police to monitor the speed of vehicles travelling through the village. At present the Charlton CSW team consists of seven volunteers operating under the leadership of Anne Hodgkins and runs about eight one-hour sessions [two per week] every other month at randomly selected times. However, we would like to recruit more volunteers to enable us to run more sessions.

During each session, a team of three monitors the traffic and records the details of any vehicles travelling at 36 mph or more. This information is passed to Wiltshire Police who issue all speeding drivers with a warning letter. Drivers recorded at 46 mph or more who live in Wiltshire receive a personal visit from Wiltshire Police to emphasise the seriousness of their behaviour.

The information also serves to alert Wiltshire Police as to where and when they can best

deploy their specialist Traffic Control staff to back up the CSW's activities with official "speed traps". Charlton is consistently towards the top of the county's "speeding tables" and the resulting Police speed traps regularly catch some speeders.

Charlton Churchyard

It's time to remove all glass and pottery containers, Christmas wreaths or artificial flowers from the graves and memorials.



Spring is on its way and very soon the churchyard grass will need to be cut regularly. To ensure that it is possible for those mowing the grass to be able to do so safely and with minimum inconvenience the PCC request that all glass and pottery containers are removed from the graves, including those buried in the grass. If these concealed containers are struck by the mower or scythe, the resulting fragments could injure not only, those working in the churchyard, but also visitors when walking around the area.

Please also remove any remaining Christmas wreaths and artificial flowers. We would ask that all non-compostable materials are taken away with you. Only compostable plant and flower debris should be added to the compost heap.

The PCC take their responsibility to provide a safe working environment seriously and any glass or pottery containers left on graves may be removed.

Thank you for your assistance in ensuring that our beautiful churchyard is a safe place for all to enjoy.

Your vote counts! Remember to apply for a postal or proxy vote now if you are going to be away or unable to get to the polling station on 1st May. To vote in person if you do not have photo ID, you need to apply for a Voter Authority Certificate. More information is on Wiltshire Council pages or contact the Electoral Services Team on 0300 456 0112.

Elections will take place for 98 Unitary Wiltshire Councillors and for the councillors in the Parish and Town Councils in Wiltshire.

The key dates for the elections are:

- You have until midnight on Friday 11 April to register to vote if not already registered.
- You have until 5pm on Monday 14 April to apply for a postal vote.
- You have until 5pm on Monday 14 to change or cancel an existing postal or proxy vote.
- You have until 5pm on Wednesday 23 April to apply for a new proxy vote
- (for someone to vote on their behalf).
- You have until 5pm on Wednesday 23 April if they want to apply for a Voter Authority Certificate (if they don't have photo ID).
- Polls are open on Thursday 1 May from 7am - 10pm
- Election results confirmed Friday 2 - Saturday 3 May

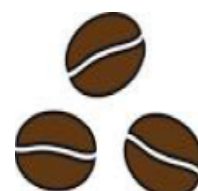

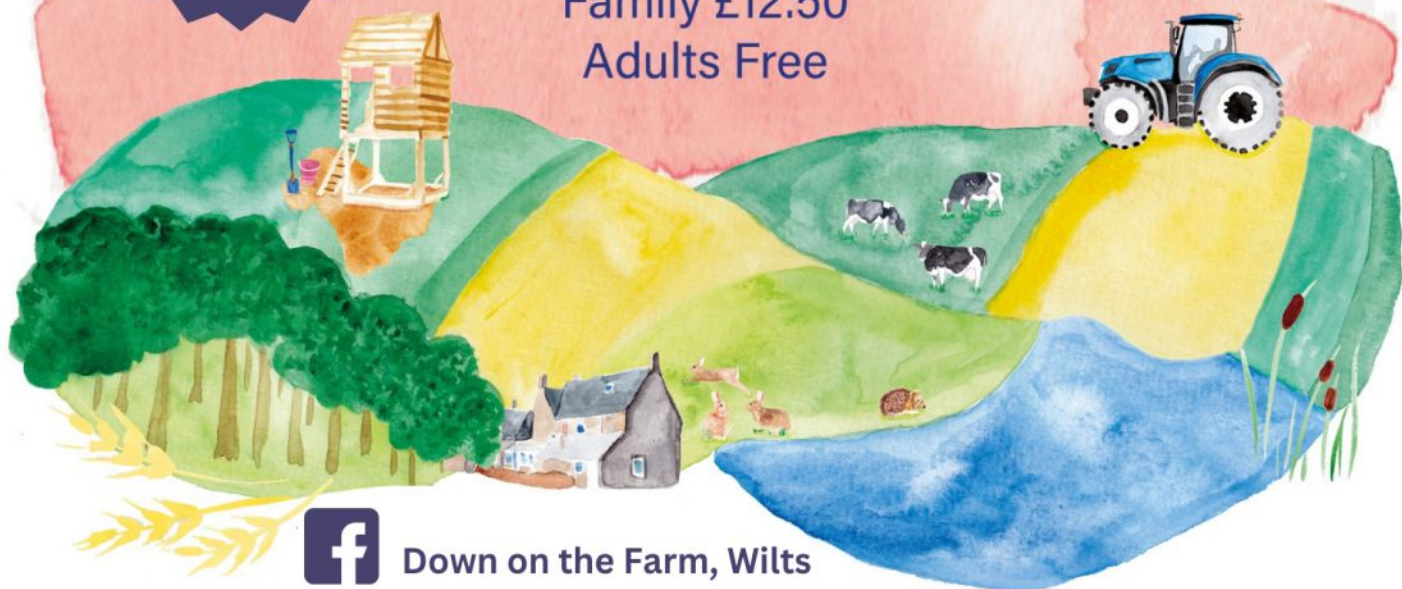

A message from our Rector, Rev'd Bob Molton

Where's the Body?

Luke 24 vs 1-2

There is abundant evidence that Jesus lived & died. Few would dispute this. The more provocative question is whether he died & lived. If Jesus rose from the dead, as millions of Christians declare every Easter, then we must accept all that He said. But, *"If he didn't rise from the dead ...why worry about any of what he said. The issue on which everything hangs is not whether or not you like his teaching, but whether or not he rose from the dead."* (Timothy Keller)

Jesus had said he would die and rise from the dead after 3 days. This was well known and is the reason guards were assigned by the authorities to watch the tomb, with a seal set. (Matthew 27:66)

What happened next has been debated for 2,000 years.

In our text, on the day after the Sabbath, the women go to the tomb with spices, to finish anointing Jesus' body. To their shock, they find the stone rolled away and the body gone.

Suggestions have been made that Jesus didn't really die but came to his senses and somehow got out of the tomb; that the disciples went to the wrong tomb, that someone else removed the body and that reports of his subsequent sighting were a case of mass hallucination.

You will probably have your own perspective on this. I find it fascinating to look at how the disciples responded in the weeks and years that followed.

They were *transformed* people. The timidness and fear that had caused them to abandon Jesus or betray him, that had them trembling behind closed doors, vanished. They were emboldened, they declared unequivocally that they had seen Jesus alive.

Doubters suggest they lied and spread the rumour that Jesus had been raised from the dead for some agenda of their own. Some agenda! Chuck Colson who went to prison for his part in the Watergate Scandal, points out that, *'Jesus' disciples were willing to be ostracized, beaten, persecuted, and all but one of them suffer a martyr's death'*.

And liars always get found out!

Colson goes on to say of himself and his co-conspirators,

There were no more than a dozen of us. Could we maintain a cover-up to save the president? Consider that we were political zealots. We enjoyed enormous political power and prestige. With all that at stake, you'd expect us to be capable of maintaining a lie to protect the president... But we couldn't do it...

Christ's disciples, by contrast, persevered boldly with their story, *'without ever [once] renouncing their conviction that they had seen Jesus bodily resurrected?'*

This deserves consideration.

The only explanation which makes any sense at all is that Jesus really did rise from the dead. And this is a life-changing, hope-filled message! It is the message of the Gospels.

If you have not ever or recently read one of the Gospels - I encourage you to do so.

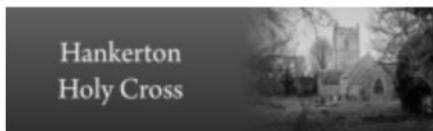
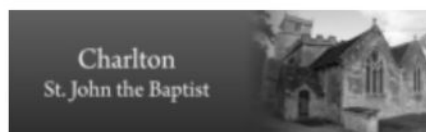
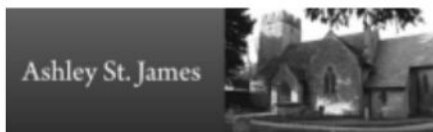
Matthew, Mark, Luke or John, can each be read in a couple of hours with a good glass of wine or a few of cups of tea.
